


Today, Tribal School Project runs 18 schools that provide free education, from Kindergarten to High School, to around 2,900 Indian tribal children.



### From Director's Desk

The Post COVID year was a challenging year for the World and our teachers were no exception.

During COVID the schools were closed but our teachers went around different villages to run Mohalla class for a small groups of Primary schools students. we had also conducted online classes for IX and X by providing Smart Phones to students, courtesy one of our donor from Kolkata.

The schools reopened after a long Covid mandatory vacation in 2022. Children had to be promoted to two classes higher without attending school. In other words the teachers were expected to cover three years syllabus in 15 months, as guided by State education authorities. With lot of hard work, our teachers completed the task successfully.

The long closure of schools damaged the systems in the Computer labs. With support of individual donors and under CSR from corporate, we could replace most of the systems in the schools.

We also needed to replace ten sets of old archery equipment and again with support from corporate CSR, we could replace all the 10 sets at HendaJuri High school.

About 70 teachers participated in an on line, three months training program, BeEkalavya Mind and Study Processing Mastery, which helped them to make children understand the concept much faster.

A volunteer from Hyderabad also extended support to train teachers on line. She also visited Ghatsila and conducted training sessions, particularly for primary teachers to improve teaching methods.

The teachers and students worked together and in class X JAC Board Examination Twenty nine out of forty students secured 1st Division and rest got 2nd Division. This is a record cent percent success since 2013.

## Activities

### Reopening of Primary schools

The primary schools reopened after long Covid vacation. All the Covid care norms have been followed. The Shishu classes were however, reopened only in July 2022, as per govt. directives. The teachers had to complete the task of covering the almost two years syllabus in the new classes. The children now in class II are directly promoted from Shishu without attending Class I and so on.



### Schools Bags Distribution

School bags have been distributed to children up to Class II in the first week of April 2022. In all 300 bags have been distributed. These bags have been provided by REACHLOCAL under their CSR.

### eVidya Vahini Data update

Annual report submission. e-Vidyavahini is a unified ICT platform that empowers the Department of School Education and Literacy, Jharkhand to monitor, measure & transform education service delivery and learning. All schools under the Tribal Project submitted the elaborate report on time.

### Ayurvedic Immunity Boosters

Ayurvedic immunity booster (Amrit Giloy) tablets, provided by a donor from Kolkata have been distributed to 400 students at Hendaajuri high school, in the third week of April 2022.

### Basic Computer Course

A free 3 months basic computer course was arranged by IGCSM Ghatsila unit for our outgoing Class X Board examinee from High School. 26 children have enrolled from the 10th Batch. The course was completed in June 2022.



### Uniforms Distribution

One set of uniform was distributed in all schools in Ghatsila, Dumuria and Ranchi. For Shishu, Class I and Class II. this was the first set of school uniform given to them, as they are attending the school for the first time after the Covid vacation.

### Periodic Assessment

Periodic Assessment have been conducted, under FA1, FA2, FA3 and half yearly and annual assessments under SA1 and SA2 held in all schools for all classes from Shishu to Class X.



### Class X Board Exam

The Class X JAC Board Exam. held in the 2nd week of April. This is the 10th Batch of Class X students of Henduljuri HS. The result was announced in May 2022. Out of the 40 participants, 29 secured 1st Division and 11 Second Division.

### Parents-Teacher Meetings

Parents-Teachers meetings held regularly in all schools. Some meetings were periodic and others for special discussions on specific matters. The topics covered included regular attendance, home work, reopening of schools in advance during summer vacation, preparations for Board exam., plantation drive, soil conservation program, Covid protocol and Class X registration.



### Rabindra Jayanti

Rabindra Jayanti (Tagore's Birthday) celebrated in all schools on 9th May 2022. Students spoke about the life and work of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore.

### Soil Conservation Awareness

Soil conservation awareness campaign was undertaken by the students of all schools in the adjoining villages on 11th May 2022.



### Guruji's Birthday celebrations

Guruji's birthday celebrated in all schools on 13th May 2022. Sweets were distributed on the occasion and children presented cultural programs. This was the last working day before summer vacation.

### World Environment Day

The World Environment Day celebrated in all schools on 6th June 2022. The importance of taking care of the environment was explained to the children.



### Birsa Munda Anniversary

The death Anniversary of tribal freedom fighter Birsa Munda was observed on 9th June 2022. At Kalchiti school a drawing competition was organized on this day. Birsa Munda (1875-1900) was Indian tribal freedom fighter, religious leader, and folk hero who belonged to the Munda tribe.

### Admit Cards Distribution

Admit Cards for Class VIII and IX Board examination has been distributed at Hendaljuri High School and Kalchiti Middle school on 24th June 2022. 53 students of Class IX and 110 students of Class VIII appeared for the examination at different centres at Ghatsila.



### Class IX Board Exam

The Class IX JAC Board Exam has been held at Bonkati Govt. High School. 53 students appeared.



### International Yoga Day

International Yoga Day has been celebrated in all schools. Students participated with lot enthusiasm.



### Class VIII Board Exam

Class VIII JAC Board Exam. held for for 32 students of Kalchiti at Barajuri Middle School and 78 students of Hendlajuri High School at MHM Middle school at Ghatsila.

### Class VIII Farewell at Kalchiti

A Farewell and get together has been organized for the outgoing Class VIII students. Kalchiti is a middle school with classes up to VIII. 32 students participated.



### Ex-student Achievements

Sima Gope, of 2016 batch of Class X, achieved her dream of becoming a BSF personnel. She visited the school, motivated the children and spent some time in the school. The students and teachers felicitated her on the occasion.



### Desktop PCs from donors

Amazon India has provided 7 Desktop PCs for the computer lab at Hendljuri high school, under their CSR in April 2022.



### Organic Farming

Immediately after the school reopened in September 2021 after Covid for higher classes, children spent time in the kitchen garden and grown few vegetables to be added to the midday meals. No fertilizers are used and only organic manure is used. Children work in the farm during the spare time.

### Teachers on line Training

A teachers training, BeEkalavya Mind and Study Processing Mastery, was conducted on line. This was a one hour duration, five days a week for three months, course. 70 teachers from Tribal schools participated. The method is being implemented in the schools.



### Sri Sri Academy Kolkata Students Visit

Eleven students and Two teachers from Sri Sri Academy, Kolkata, visited our schools for their IAYP Residential Project. They spent time in the schools, interacted with the children and visited nearby villages.

### Class X Farewell and Felicitation

As in every year all the 40 students of Class X 10th Batch passed out. 29 of them secured First division and 11 Second Division. On 23rd July 2022, the Administrators of 4 local Panchayats surrounding the School felicitated the students at a function. The JAC Board Exam. mark sheets were also handed over to the students.



### Independence Day

The 75th Independence Day has been celebrated in all tribal schools. Sweets were distributed on the occasion and children presented cultural programs.



### Raksha Bandhan

Rekshabandan celebrated in all schools on 10th August 2022. Children also tied Rakhi to trees with a promise to protect them.



### Covid Booster Vaccine

The Covaxin second dose (booster) for the remaining 95 children in the age group 12 to 14 has been administered in the school on 1st August 2022.

### Hindi Diwas

Hindi Diwas has been celebrated in all schools on 14th September 2022. The importance and contribution of the Hindi language have been elaborated. Children presented Hindi poems, speeches and dance dramas.



### Teachers' Day

Teachers' Day has been celebrated in all schools on 5th September 2022. Children presented a number of programs for the teachers.

### Archery Coaching

After long Covid vacation, most of the Archery team members of class have passed out and left the school. A new team of 30 members were selected and basic coaching resumed on 1st August 2022. A final group of 10 members will be selected to represent the school in the coming days.

Within a matter of just 50 days in to archery coaching, the school team participated in a competition organized by Tata Sports Foundation at Kasturba Gandhi Girls School on 26th September 2022. Salge Soren of Class VII won the Bronze medal.



### Save the Earth

This year 990 saplings of fruit bearing trees have been distributed through the children of the tribal schools in two phases, during July and August 2022. There is a 12 month monitoring system in place with the help of local teachers. The children are entrusted to take care of the plants and ensure it survives.

### Football Coaching

The football coaching was discontinued in April 2020 due Covid holidays. A batch 30 senior boys has been selected and the coaching resumed on 1st September 2022. Coaching for girls team and a junior boys has also be introduced simultaneously. Just after completion of 2 month's coaching, the Junior boys and Senior boys team participated in football tournaments and declared second runners up and runners up respectively.




### Vishwakarma Puja




### Award for Progress

An NGO from Kolkata distributed a 800 colorful booklet in Hindi and English on Save the Environment to all children in Ghatsila and Ranchi schools.



### Navratri Celebrations

Durga Puja and Navratri has been celebrated in all schools.



### Diwali Celebrations

Diwali has been celebrated in all schools. Rangoli competitions have been held. Children decorated the school with diyas. Children also participated in cultural programs.

### Bhaidooj

Bhaidooj has been celebrated in all schools. A festival of best wishes and care from sisters to brothers.



### Children's Day

Children's Day and Pandit Nehru's birthday has been celebrated in all schools. On the occasion Quiz competition, drawing competitions and games were organized. Children also took part in cultural programs.

### Blanket Distribution at Villages

As in every year this year also blankets have been distributed to poor senior citizens in the villages surrounding the school during November 2022. In all 800 blankets have been distributed.



### National Unity Day

National Unity Day has been celebrated in all schools on 31st October 2022.



### Feeding Poor village girls

About 150 young girls from villages have been served meals at the Hendaljuri High school premises, as a part of Navratri celebrations.



### Medical Camps

Free Medical Camps, once in a fortnight, are held at 6 schools. The number of beneficiaries were 4231 of which 1454 were new patients. More than 70 villages are benefited from the 108 camps held during the year.

### Run-a-thon Participation

As in every year JRD Tata Sports Complex organized a Run-a-thon at Jamshedpur in November 2022. Nineteen boys from foot ball team of HendaJhuri High School participated.



### Scholarship

Eight Class VII students have been selected for Jyoti Fellowship from Tisco. They will get a scholarship till they complete Class XII depending upon their yearly academic performance.

### Sweater Distribution

Before the onset of winter, sweaters have been distributed in all schools, in November 2022.



### New Admission

New Admission for 2023-24 session process has been conducted in all tribal schools in the first week of March 2023. This year a total of 296 children in primary schools, Shishu Class and 101 children at High School in V and VI classes have been registered. Most of the children admitted in the High School are children passed out from SSVM primary schools.

### Art Excel program

Art Excel program was conducted at three centres for children of class III to VIII during the months of February and March 2023. A total of 344 students participated from three schools, in the 6 days program.



### Balmela

'Bal Mela', a program of learning through fun and fair has been organized at four centres, each participated by 200 students from adjacent schools. This is an annual program.

### Drawing Competition

The annual drawing competition held in different groups at different centres during first week of January 2023.



### Holi Celebration

Holi has been celebrated in the first week of March in all schools.

### New Year

A picnic was organized in individual schools on the New Year's Day 2023.



### Republic Day Celebrations

Republic Day was celebrated in all schools along with Saraswati Puja. Like every year Sweets were distributed on the occasion and children presented cultural programs.



### Saraswati Puja

The most important festival of the tribal villages, Saraswati Puja has been celebrated in all schools on the 26th January 2023, which was also the Republic Day.

### World Water Day

World Water day has been celebrated in all schools. The children have been explained the importance of preservation of environment and water.



### World Science Day

World Science Day has been celebrated in all schools in the last week of February 2023. In the



exhibition on the occasion children demonstrated models of Digestive system, Layers of soil, Volcano eruption, Water filter, Water Pressure, Bank Security system and working Lungs. Class IX and X students of Hendaljuri high school participated in a Science fair.
